Cleaning and Support Services NOS

An Occupational map is a structured way of describing the functions carried out by professionals in specific occupational areas.

Key Purpose

Working safely and effectively to ensure that the required area or surface are free from dirt and contamination while maintaining environmentally friendly and sustainable working conditions.

Key Competency Areas

These standards cover the range of functions carried out by professionals involved in cleaning and support services. They include a variety of competence areas such as working within designated procedures, team working, management and supervision, health and safety, using the equipment to provide cleaning services, being environmentally friendly and maintaining sustainability.
